Bumblebees will <u>POLLINATE</u> a flower when it is in the <u>FLOWERING</u> stage of its life cycle.

A bumblebee has four stages in it's lifecycle: egg, larva, <u>PUPA</u>, and adult. After being laid, the eggs <u>HATCH</u> after four days and the queen feeds the larva on <u>POLLEN</u> and <u>NECTAR</u>.

A queen bumblebee will lay all the <u>EGGS</u>. And her <u>WORKER</u> bees will look after the nest, <u>COLLECT</u> food and raise new <u>OFFSPRING</u>.
